- ✓ SIS Board of Directors and administration must ensure an audit on the school's financial records is conducted routinely and in a timely manner to verify appropriate financial practices and resource use.
- ✓ SIS administration needs to provide teachers with more opportunities to work on their Understanding by Design (UBD) Templates/Unit Plans to improve and provide consistency in instruction.
- ✓ SIS administration and teachers need to focus on intentional alignment of the curriculum to the standards and the SLOs to positively impact student achievement.

## **Critical Areas for Focus**

- ✓ SIS administration needs to ensure accountability in the monitoring of the curriculum to maintain consistency in grading policy, unit plans, syllabi across all curricular areas and grades.
- ✓ SIS administration and teachers need to standardize best practices in classroom instruction, i.e. posting of agenda and learning objectives, to improve student learning across all grades.
- ✓ SIS administration and team leaders need to provide accountability for monitoring the instruction in the classroom to assure consistency and focus on standards and curriculum
- ✓ SIS stakeholders should enhance the supports necessary to address students' social, emotional, and personal issues.
